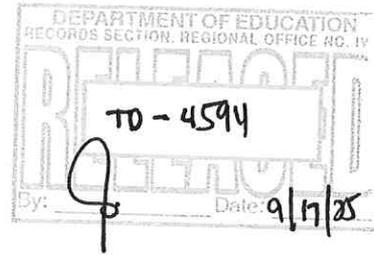

Per Memorandum DM-OUOPS-2025-1823, s. 2025, dated August 12, 2025, from the Office of the Undersecretary for Operations, the three DepEd strands—Operations through the Bureau of Learner Support Services–Youth Formation Division (BLSS-YFD), Learning System through the Bureau of Curriculum Development (BCD), and Human Resource and Organizational Development through the National Educators’ Academy of the Philippines (NEAP)—have been actively conducting various training and capacity-building activities since 2023. DepEd aims to ensure that by October 2025, at least 50% of secondary schools nationwide will have two trained, certified, and designated Career Advocates (CAs)—ideally one male and one female per school.

To help achieve this target, the Office of the Undersecretary for Operations (OUOPS), in coordination with BCD and NEAP, will conduct the **Career Guidance Training (Phase 4) cum Capacity Building for Career Advocates**. This training is scheduled from **September 29 to October 3, 2025**, in the National Capital Region (NCR).

Republic Act No. 11206, also known as the “Secondary School Career Guidance and Counseling Act,” aims to institutionalize comprehensive career guidance programs in secondary schools throughout the Philippines. Spearheaded by the Department of Education (DepEd), in collaboration with various partner agencies, this initiative seeks to equip learners with the necessary skills and knowledge to make informed decisions regarding their education and future careers—aligned with current labor market trends.

In line with this goal, three DepEd strands—Operations through the Bureau of Learner Support Services - Youth Formation Division (BLSS-YFD), Learning System through the Bureau of Curriculum Development (BCD), and Human Resource and Organizational Development through the National Educators’ Academy of the Philippines (NEAP)—have been actively conducting various training and capacity-building activities since 2023.

Among these initiatives is the School-Based Training of Career Advocates (SBTCA), which has been implemented in several regions since June. This activity forms part of DepEd’s commitment to the Asian Development Bank (ADB) under the Secondary Education Support Program (SESP). As part of this commitment, DepEd aims to ensure that by October 2025, at least 50% of secondary schools nationwide will have



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two trained, certified, and designated Career Advocates (CAs)—ideally one male and one female per school.

To help achieve this target, the Office of the Undersecretary for Operations (OUOPS), in coordination with BCD and NEAP, will conduct the **Career Guidance Training (Phase 4) cum Capacity Building for Career Advocates**. This training is scheduled from **September 29 to October 3, 2025**, in the **National Capital Region (NCR)**.

With this, the OUOPS, through the BLSS-YFD, respectfully requests all Regional Offices to **nominate two plantilla teacher-participants** (one male and one female), in accordance with the distribution list provided below.
