



This has reference to Office Memorandum No. OUOPS-2025-11-0188 titled "Conduct of the Classroom-Based Session Against Online Sexual Abuse or Exploitation of Children (OSAEC) and Child Sexual Abuse or Exploitation Materials (CSAEM)," the same was approved for implementation in the schools last March 20, 2025. The Program aims to increase awareness against OSAEC and CSAEM through integration in appropriate subject areas and its core messages at the elementary and secondary levels, reflecting the Department of Education's 5-point Reform Agenda, specifically in promoting learners' well-being and reinforcing the importance of establishing a safe and positive learning environment.

In line therewith, this Office, through the Learner Rights and Protection Division (LRPD) issues this Memorandum to remind our field personnel of the implementation of the classroom-based discussion, the same can be accessed at this link: <https://tinyurl.com/2025AntiOSAECDraft>

Additionally, the issuance of this request is timely, as our partners, the Stairway Foundation Inc. (SFI) and Meta Philippines, have introduced their program -

“Localized Take it Down Campaign” which aims to enable our learners to proactively request the removal or prevention of explicit images or videos online through a secure and confidential platform. This initiative is integrated into the existing classroom-based session guides on OSAEC and CSAEM.

Further, to monitor the implementation of the program, as well as lead in the conversation with learners and school personnel to combat OSAEC and CSAEM, this Office, through the LRPD requests the conduct of a scheduled “Take it Down Conversations.” The proposed schedule for which may be seen below:

Cluster and Region	Timeline
Luzon National Capital Region MIMAROPA	To be determined
Visayas Region VI – Western Visayas	
Mindanao Region XI - Davao	

To ensure that learners’ classes are not unnecessarily disrupted, the LRPD proposes that the LRP on Wheels be conducted simultaneously with the scheduled “Take it Down Conversations” for each identified area. The Regional Offices are asked to identify one (1) school for hosting the activity and to select two hundred (200) junior high school learners to participate. It is also requested that the chosen school have a canteen where our partners can request snacks for our participants, the cost of which shall be covered by our partners.
