In celebration of the National Heritage Month, the National Museum of the Philippines - Marinduque-Romblon Area Museum will facilitate "HIKIT", a free online lecture-demonstration on "nito" weaving on 24 May 2021 from 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM through Zoom and Facebook Live (NM Marinduque-Romblon Area).

The lecture-demo will feature the members of Bintakay Nito Weavers Association, a community-based livelihood project of the Diocese of Boac. The weavers will share to the participants their knowledge on the use and sustainability of raw materials, weaving techniques and designs, development of weaving skills over the years, and other personal experiences on nito weaving.

National Museum researchers John Rey Callado of the Botany and National Herbarium Division and Danette Jennifer Megalbio of the Ethnology Division will also present the taxonomy, diversity and conservation of nito or Philippine Lygodium and the nito weaving traditions of Marinduque and neighboring islands in the context of cultural heritage, respectively.

The activity is in collaboration with the NMP Gender and Development Focal Point System (GAD-FPS), the Ethnology and the Botany and National Herbarium Divisions.
