Immediate and wide dissemination of the contents of this Memorandum is desired.



- Ensure delivery and proper installation of Insecticide-Treated Screens (ITS or Olyset) to the allocated schools by the District offices.


Greetings from CHD MIMAROPA!

In reference to Morbidity Week 34 Dengue case record of the Department of Health Center for Health Development MIMAROPA surveillance system, which is 64.95% higher than the same period last year, we are reiterating vigilance in the implementation of the Dengue 5S Strategies, namely *Search and Destroy mosquito breeding sites, Self-Protection measures, Seek Early Consultation, Say Yes to Aflasting during impending Outbreak, and Sustain Hydration.*

With the emphasis on the *Search and Destroy mosquito breeding sites* and *Self-Protection measures*, we would like to request your support in implementing a weekly clean-up drive and a temporary modification of school uniforms. We recommend that students wear light-colored clothes, long sleeves, and pants to protect the skin from mosquito bites.
