

Immediate and wide dissemination of the contents of this Memorandum is desired.



Greetings from CHD MIMAROPA!

Allow us to extend our utmost gratitude for your prompt response to dengue interventions and activities through your Department Memorandum ESSD-SHNS-2023-098 dated 21 September 2023.

While protective measures have been pre-positioned in different schools, the altered climate patterns associated with El Niño may adversely affect climate-sensitive sectors, including water resources, impelling households to collect and save water in containers, which in turn create favorable environments for *Aedes* mosquitoes to reproduce and transmit the dengue virus.

As of February 7, 2024, the Department of Health Center for Health Development MIMAROPA surveillance systems recorded a total of 617 dengue cases, including ten (10) deaths – 27.33% lower than the same period last year. Chikungunya was also recorded in the province of Palawan with a total of 49 cases.

In line with this, may we reiterate the advocacy and practice of *Deng-Get Out 5S*. Also, we would like to request your continuous support through the regular issuance of advisories, reminding all public and private schools to intensify the implementation of *Aedes*-borne viral disease prevention and control measures.






Distribution of Chikungunya Cases by Municipality/City













Distribution of Cases by Case Classification






Distribution by Outcome




Distribution by Sex and Age Group
