

READING INVENTORY FOR KEY STAGES 2 AND 3 FOR  
SCHOOL YEAR 2024-2025**

**DATE :** **November 20, 2024**

Per Memorandum DM-CT-2024-447 from the Office of the Undersecretary for Curriculum and Teaching, the Revised Philippine Informal Reading Inventory (Phil-IRI) assessment shall continue to be administered to all learners in public elementary schools nationwide to measure and describe the learners' reading performance in both English and Filipino languages in oral reading, silent reading, and listening comprehension.

For the current school year, the Phil-IRI shall be administered to Key Stage 2 (Grades 4 to 6) and Key Stage 3 (Grades 7 to 10). The same procedure stipulated in the Phil-IRI Manual 2018 shall be followed. The materials for Phil-IRI Key Stage 3 are accessible through this link: <https://tinyurl.com/PhilIRIJHSmaterials>.

Please refer to the attached memorandum for the schedule of activities and general directions for administration of Phil-IRI for Key Stage 3.

The school head/school reading coordinator shall consolidate the data which includes the results of the Group Screening Test (GST) and Individualized Assessment, and the data shall be uploaded in the Phil-IRI School Submission form through this link: [https://bit.ly/Phil-IRI\\_SchoolSubmission](https://bit.ly/Phil-IRI_SchoolSubmission).

The Phil-IRI data serves as a key reference for planning and designing or refining teachers' reading instruction and the school's reading programs or activities to enhance overall reading performance. Additionally, the collected data will play a
