

**2025 PRIVATE SCHOOLS SUMMIT**

1. The Department of Education (DepEd) MIMAROPA Region, through the Quality Assurance Division, will host the 2025 Private Schools Summit on May 14-17, 2025, at a venue to be announced in a separate advisory. With the theme ***Strengthening Private Schools Through Advancement, Resilience, Knowledge, and Synergy***, the summit highlights our commitment to enhancing the quality of education in the region.
2. This summit aims to achieve the following objectives:
  - a. Strengthen private school governance by providing updates on policies and legal frameworks relevant to private school operations and equipping school administrators with effective leadership and management strategies to enhance institutional resilience.
  - b. Enhance academic excellence and innovation by fostering a culture of continuous learning through academic competitions and professional development activities and integrating innovative teaching strategies aligned with national education standards.
  - c. Promote cultural appreciation and talent development by highlighting the significance of Philippine arts, music, and heritage through competitions and showcase of talent.
  - d. Foster collaboration and networking by strengthening the partnerships between private schools within the MIMAROPA region and encouraging the exchange of best practices and collective problem-solving among educational leaders.

4. Private schools currently receiving ESC, JDVP, SHS Voucher, and TSS Grants are enjoined to participate in the summit. In addition, Schools Division Office SEPS-SMME are directed to determine the number of attendees and to gather participants' significant information through the online form which can be accessed on this link <https://tinyurl.com/pss2025registration> on or before April 30, 2025. Only registered participants can attend the summit.
5. All SDOs are requested to submit one (1) entry for each of the indicated contests under the categories Sibol and Alab. Mechanics of the contests are found in Annex 1 of this Memorandum. Division Focal person must submit the list of contestants by accomplishing this online form: <https://tinyurl.com/PSScontestEntries>.
6. Each Schools Division Office (SDO) must submit one (1) video presentation of one selected school. This video will showcase how private schools support DepEd initiatives by highlighting their projects, innovations, and best practices. The videos must be visually engaging and feature meaningful and unique content. The video presentation must meet the following specifications:
  - a. The video presentation should not exceed three (3) minutes in length.
  - b. The presentation should showcase the unique initiatives, achievements, and good practices of the identified school.
  - c. The video should be in a widely compatible format, such as MP4 or MOV, to ensure easy viewing across different devices and platforms.
  - d. The video should be at least 720p HD resolution to ensure clarity and quality of visuals.
  - e. The final video presentation must be submitted on or before April 28, 2025, at [qad.mimaroparegion@deped.gov.ph](mailto:qad.mimaroparegion@deped.gov.ph).
  - f. Any special technical requirements for playback should be communicated well in advance to ensure compatibility and smooth running during the summit.

**2025 PRIVATE SCHOOLS SUMMIT  
CONTEST MECHANICS**

**I. SIBOL: Cultivating Innovation and Excellence**

SIBOL, meaning "growth" or "flourish," represents the commitment of private schools to fostering creativity, research, and innovation in education. This category features contests that challenge educators to develop groundbreaking instructional strategies and showcase their expertise in various academic fields, driving continuous improvement in teaching and learning.

**A. InnovatED: Instructional Materials Improvisation Challenge**

1. Open to all registered participants of the Private Schools Summit. Each Schools Division Office (SDO) may send ONLY one (1) team of three (3) members (teachers, administrators, or both).
2. Teams will be assigned a Science or Mathematics competency (Grade 7-10) and must design and create innovative, improvised instructional material using only the provided resources within two (2) hours.
3. Each team will present their output in a 5-minute presentation, followed by a 5-minute Q&A session.
4. Outputs will be judged using the following criteria:

<b>Criteria</b>	<b>Percentage</b>
<b>Alignment with the Given Competency</b> – Relevance of the material to the assigned topic	25%
<b>Effectiveness &amp; Usability</b> – Practicality, ease of use, and potential impact on learning	25%
<b>Creativity &amp; Resourcefulness</b> – Originality and innovative use of materials	20%
<b>Execution &amp; Presentation</b> – Clarity, confidence, and fluency in delivery	20%
<b>Audience Engagement</b> – Ability to captivate and involve students (class)	10%
<b>Total</b>	<b>100%</b>

5. Top 3 Best IMs will be awarded. The judges' decisions are final and irrevocable.

**B. paUTAKan: Super Quiz Bowl**

1. Open to all registered participants of the summit. Each Schools Division Office (SDO) may send one (1) pair (teachers, administrators, or both).
2. The quiz consists of three rounds:
  - Round 1: Easy** (10 questions, 10 seconds, 1 point each, multiple-choice)
  - Round 2: Average** (10 questions, 15 seconds, 3 points each, mix of multiple-choice and short answers)

**Round 3: Difficult** (10 questions, 30 seconds, 5 points each, short-answer and problem-solving)

**3. Topics Covered:**

- ✓ General Knowledge (History, Science, Mathematics Arts, Sports, Literature)
- ✓ Current Events (National & International)
- ✓ Education & Pedagogy (Teaching Methods, Learning Theories, Policies)
- ✓ Private School Governance (Laws, Best Practices)
- ✓ MIMAROPA Culture (Traditions, Festivals, Folk Arts)

4. Top three highest scorers will be recognized. In case of a tie, a tiebreaker question will determine the winner.

**II. ALAB (Igniting Passion for Culture and the Arts)**

**C. PSS The Voice: Teachers' Edition**

1. Open to all registered participants of the summit. Each Schools Division Office (SDO) may send one (1) contestant (teachers, administrators, or other registered participants).

2. Each contestant will perform one (1) song from the following categories:

- ✓ Kundiman or Traditional Filipino Music
- ✓ OPM (Original Pilipino Music)

3. Performance length: 3 to 5 minutes, including intros and endings.

4. Contestants may perform a cappella or with minus one (MP3 format), to be submitted one hour before the competition.

5. Attire should be appropriate and complement the chosen song.

**6. Judging Criteria:**

Criteria	Percentage
<b>Vocal Quality &amp; Technique</b> – Pitch, tone, clarity, and vocal control	40%
<b>Musicality &amp; Interpretation</b> – Expressiveness, phrasing, emotional depth	30%
<b>Stage Presence &amp; Confidence</b> – Audience engagement, posture, and delivery	15%
<b>Diction &amp; Clarity</b> – Pronunciation and articulation of lyrics	10%
<b>Overall Impact</b> – General impression and Appeal	5%
<b>Total</b>	<b>100%</b>
